The Results Are in: Mental Health Charities to Receive Grants

A Successful Year for MHANe Members and Looking Ahead

Salem, MA — Mental Health and Addiction Network (MHANe) announced that \$366,846 was pledged to 25 national charities in the 2014 CFC—the U.S. government’s workplace giving campaign. **MHANe is the only federation of charities designed to receive and distribute CFC funds specifically to mental health, addiction and intellectual disability focused organizations.**

With grants and other funding becoming increasingly difficult to find in the field of mental health, addiction and intellectual disability fundraising, MHANe recognizes that individual workplace giving through the CFC can be a powerful source of support. Since its founding in 2005, **MHANe has distributed more than \$4 Million in unrestricted funds** to its member charities. To help secure these funds, MHANe highlights its charities for federal employees interested in giving to mental health organizations through the CFC.

The CFC, which has been operating for more than 50 years, is the world’s largest and most successful annual workplace charity campaign. Only charities that meet strict criteria are eligible for inclusion.

“It is not easy to become an approved Combined Federal Campaign charity,” noted Executive Director Benjamin Waxman. “The charities we review and recommend to the government for the CFC are highly qualified organizations that are setting the standard for advocacy, research and treatment nationwide.” Such organizations can benefit greatly from the CFC, which raises more than \$250 Million each year through the generous support of federal workers.

As the 2015 CFC kicks off this September, more than two dozen charities recommended by MHANe will participate. Waxman commented, “We are delighted that the member organizations we recommended to the U.S. government were admitted to the fall 2014 CFC. Nearly four million federal workers are eligible to donate to CFC certified charities, so this represents an unparalleled opportunity for our members to reach potential donors and receive this unrestricted funding.”
